Francis is an active member of Scotts United Methodist Church, in Trappe, Maryland where he served as a member of the Trustee Board. Francis is married to Florence Virginia Wilson. His daughters, Venolla, Lisa, and Shelia, his son-in-law, Kevin and his two granddaughters: Kerwyn Spears and Kendryck Spears are his special jewels. Francis is the proprietor of Wilson's Barbershop, located on 18 Glenwood Avenue, Easton, Maryland. He has been a professional barber for nearly fifty years.
